

#### Which areas are covered from Filey and Eastfield Police Stations?

The areas in blue and yellow – covered from Eastfield Police station. Areas in green – covered from Filey Police Station.



There were 120 incidents reported in your area during June. Incidents of note are as follows: -

We need your help. During May and June in the areas covered from Eastfield and Filey Police Station, we have uncovered four substantial cannabis grows in relatively small properties. Approximately 1,000 plants worth hundreds of thousands of pounds have been seized. Two arrests have been made, one person has been sentenced to prison and another is on remand awaiting their next court date. All of these properties have been rented by people from outside of North Yorkshire and undoubtedly involve organised criminality. Landlords also often live out of the area so are unaware of the activities. We are asking you to be our eyes and ears within the community. Have you seen any properties which have been recently rented out and are now rarely occupied? Things to note include:-

- curtains always closed,
- lone people (usually males) attending the property and then not reappearing for days,
- extractor fans on and a smell of cannabis coming from the fan, this isn't always they case tough.
- alterations being made to a newly rented property without the knowledge of the landlord, these could involve plaster board and wood being taken in, large lighting units being taken in, compost, plant pots and fertiliser being taken in etc...
- Electrical works being carried out on the property.

Please don't assume if you live in a more affluent area that this won't be on your street, we have seen locally a very expensive house rented out and altered to take a cannabis grow. Don't hesitate to contact us, you won't look daft if you are wrong, contact us so we can assess the information.

During June, demand was high from the large caravan sites covered from Filey Police Station. This resulted in numerous arrests and some serious incidents.

01/06/2024 19:20 - A two vehicle non-injury RTC occurred on A165 near to the junction with A1039. Officers attended to manage the scene and assist with recovery.

03/06/2024 01:26 – A vehicle struck a building on the 90 degree sharp turn in Muston village. Officers attended and located the driver who failed a road side breath test, the non-evidential sample provided was almost three times the legal limit. He was arrested on suspicion of drink driving and later reported for summons for failing to provide a sample of blood for analysis.

04/06/2024 18:15 – A two vehicle non-injury RTC was reported from Hunmanby Road at Reighton, a passing ambulance stopped to assist. Officers attended to manage the scene and assist with recovery.

05/06/2024 10:55 – A resident reports receiving a scam call from the HMRC. On the other end of the call was an automated message stating that criminal action was being taken against them and to press 1 to speak to an Officer. The resident pressed 1, waited for 3 minutes but no one answered. Thankfully no financial loss was suffered. This scam was doing the round more frequently a couple of years ago but seems to be on the increase again, the end result of the call is invariably that residents are asked to pay the money over the phone using their bank details to stave off arrest. On one occasion several years ago, a resident was so scared they turned up at Eastfield Police Station expecting us to arrest them. Unless you are expecting it and have reason to speak to them, don't engage with phone calls purporting to be from the HMRC.

14/06/2024 03:43 – A male driving a car was stopped by Officers on patrol on A1039 at Flixton. The driver was arrested on suspicion of drug driving a later released pending the result of a blood test.

15/06/2024 09:13 — A vehicle suspected to be drink driving was initially seen on A165 near Filey. It was stopped by Officers shortly after entering Scarborough, the driver failed an initial roadside breath test so was arrested on suspicion of drink driving having drunk the night before. By the time the evidential breath test was taken in custody, they were just within the legal limit so were released with no further action.

25/06/2024 23:22 – A serious injury RTC was reported on A165 south of The Dotterel. Officers from Filey attended as did ambulance and fire. Please report any information on 101 and quote incident 12240112895, particularly if you were driving on this road at that time and have dash camera footage. Motorcyclist seriously injured in collision on A165 near Reighton - BBC News
